Report on JSPS program,

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1. On the preparation

First of all, I would like to express my sincere thanks to the ASAFAS and GCOE program that allow me the opportunity to attend this exchange program which is directly promoted of the social scientists to share their points of views "toward sustainable humanosphare." I see this connectivity of how the project is an attempt to link the natural scientists and social scientists in supporting the concept of sustainable humanosphare that is needed the integration of both fields for establishing the sustainability of both human society and ecology.

The program is really flexible for me which I could take extra schedule differently from other participants. Once again, thank you so much for your highly attention to give us, participants from Faculty of Social Sciences, NUOL, the priority to attend this program. 2. On the workshop

The workshop is well organized and facilitating. The workshop is organized in a way that is more relaxed even it is academic workshop. It is the place that I can participate in the activity and learning of some Japanese traditional knowledge related to rafting activity. It is also unforgettable experience with the home stay at Miyama community. An informal interview is made shortly with the *Oto-san* who is the owner of the traditional Japanese house where I stay. This is an attempt to learn more about the life of local people, society, culture, thought and a short research experience in a different culture. However, the weakness of my Japanese knowledge is hindered of the interview. If possible, I wish to come back to do comparative study on the management of home stay tourism in the village again. Visiting the Lake Biwa Environmental Research Institution is enhanced me more of the understanding of the important role of the research institute in contribution to the natural resource preservation in particular the water resource. This is very worthy investment if the quality of the water as well as the aquatic resource is really improved as reported by the institute. The final enthusiasm is with the fish cooperative with the warm welcome and great care of the importance of the protection of forest and other related flora and fauna that is related to the breeding of the fish in the Biwa Lake, and sustainable catch techniques.

4. On the 2nd GCOE conference

The conference is enhanced me more on the knowledge of the concept of sustainable humanosphere and related issues. Though the concept is new to me, from various presentations and discussions of the researchers I could gain more knowledge on it. The program of the 'in searching for the sustainable humanosphere' is revealing of the innovative idea of a modern society like Japan. 5. On general management
